






How does Literacy Pro help develop successful independent readers?

Literacy Pro is a research-based, blended literacy program supporting your school's literacy goals. It is individualized to encourage students to read texts matched to their abilities, allowing them to gain valuable reading practice and build comprehension skills.



Literacy Pro is powered by The Lexile® Framework for Reading

- 1. Developed based on over 30 years of research
- 2. Lexile measures are global standard in reading assessment and are accurate for all ages, including first and second language learners
- 3. The Lexile (L) data in Literacy Pro **measures** two critical aspects relevant to **reading comprehension development**:
 - Reading Ability (Level) refers to student's reading level in Lexile, which student received from Lit Pro Test
 - Text Complexity refers to the level of difficulty of reading materials in Lexile such as the books


How is student reading ability assessed?

Students take the Lexile test that adapts to their responses.

Literacy Pro assesses students' reading comprehension through the Lit Pro Test. It determines their Lexile Reading Measure by using authentic passages from fiction and non-fictions texts. Teachers can easily assign the LitPro Test to be taken periodically to track students progress.

A student starts the test on an average Lexile item for their year level. If a student answers a question correctly, he/she is given a more challenging question. If the student answers the question incorrectly, a question at a lower Lexile is posed. After approximately 26 to 36 questions, the student's reading level in Lexile will be determined.





The Lexile scale is a continuous development scale. Literacy Pro gathers the results from Lexile tests over time, so a student's **reading development** can be tracked.

How is Lexile text complexity analyzed?

Through the Lexile Analyzer, text complexity is determined based on difficulty of sentence level (syntactic) and word level (semantic). The algorithm that is used to determine the Lexile measure of book or piece of text is now enhanced to provide more precise measurement of materials read in Kindergarten to Grade 2 classrooms. As a result, nine-variable model provides early-reading indicators that help identify important text features. These are categorized into four early-reading indictors and assigned a level of difficulty for typical Kindergarten to Grade 2 books (see example on the right)

NINE TEXT EARLY-READING INDICATORS COMPLEXITY VARIABLES **Structure Indicator** 1. Text Density looks at what is going on with text as a whole by evaluating the degree of 2. Phrase Diversity repetition and patterning (e.g., repeated phrases) in the text. Repeated phrases lower the Structure Indicator. 3. Non-Compressibility **Syntactic Indicator** looks at what is going on at the 4. Intersentenial sentence level by evaluating the Complexity complexity within sentences and across sentences. 5. Age of Acquisition Semantic Indicator looks at what is going on with the words used by evaluating the challenge of word meanings in a text. 6. Word Rareness 7. Abstractness Decoding Indicator looks at parts of the words like vowel 8. Monosyllable **Decoding Demand** and consonant patterns, and sounds by evaluating the patterns of letters 9. Syllable Count in a word.



How is student reading performance assessed?

There are four key sources of data:

1. LitPro Test Data

- 3. Online comprehension Book Quizzes
- 2. LitPro Comprehension Skill Test
- 4. Norm-referenced research data

Lit Pro Test Data

Average Lexile is the current average of students' Lexile measures, by year of class.

Average Lexile Growth shows the growth of students in the class, from the starting and current Lexile measure.

Reading Proficiency shows the actual reading proficiency of students compared to the level of texts they are expected to read.

Book Quiz Data

Average Quiz Score is compiled from all book quizzes students have taken during the current school year.

Quiz Pass Rate summarizes the percentage of quizzes passed.

Number of Quizzes Taken is the total number of book quizzes students have attempted.

Words Read is the total number of words of all the books whose quizzes students have passed.

LitPro Comprehension Skill Test

Available for Level 3 - 8 (30L - 950L), The LitPro Comprehension Skills Test (LPCST) enable teachers to understand students' reading proficiency and progress in critical reading comprehension skills, including start-of-year, mid-year and end-of-year tests for all level to provide teachers with a complete understanding of your students' progress throughout the year.

Each grade will be assessed with these 10 critical reading skills shown below:

- Understanding text structures and organizational patterns
- Predicting
- Identifying main ideas and key details
- Identifying sequence of events
- Inferring

- Drawing conclusions
- Summarizing and synthesizing


Types of Reports Available

Lexile reading proficiency

Reading proficiency is being able to read the text expected for a grade level. Literacy Pro provides several benchmark options which includes LP Standard (American), Singapore (Singapore), UK and Global English Language Learners (ESL and EFL learners). This provides the benchmark against which teachers can evaluate the Lexile scores of their students, to determine if they are reading on-grade level, above or below.

Literacy Pro uses norm-referenced data to identify the average end-of-year Lexile. Research is conducted to find the expected Lexile growth for students based on starting Lexile and year level. This data may be used to forecast growth, set


goals, and identify gaps that might need specific intervention, and evaluate actual development.









How do students develop their reading skills using **Literacy Pro?**


Students are guided towards texts that will challenge but not frustrate them.





Snapshot of Progress with Year on Year Normalized Reports




Book Quizzes

Book quizzes are taken independently to **test comprehension** of books read. It can **be assigned** to students to determine their understanding of the books you recommend or have finished reading in a class.




Book Rating

Leveled Skill Practice




