Craft Activities Blue Bird

WLDIARIES

MATERIALS:

- 1 large pinecone
- 1 extra-large acorn (available at most craft stores)
- · 2 blue pipe cleaners
- Yellow paper (1/4" strip from a 8-1/2" x 11" sheet)
- White felt (1/4" strip from a 9" x 12" sheet)
- Black felt (1/4" strip from a 9" x 12" sheet)
- Blue paint
- · Hot glue gun & hot glue sticks
- Scissors
- Paintbrush
- Paint palette (If you don't have one of these at home, a paper plate will do!)

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Paint the pinecone and acorn blue and let them dry overnight.
- 2. Hot glue the acorn (head) to the top of the pinecone (body).
 - Tip: Hold it in place until the glue dries!
- Cut pipe cleaners for the arms and legs. Use the size of your pinecone as a guide, but they should be about 2" per arm, 3" per leg, and 1-1/2" for each finger/toe.
- 4. Cut out four 1-inch pieces of pipe cleaner.
 - Bend these pieces in half to form a V-shape
 Hot glue one V-shaped piece to each arm and leg, centering the larger pipe cleaner in the middle of the V-shape to make a hand/foot shape.



- 5. Glue the arms and legs (which now include hands and feet) onto the bird body.
- 6. Cut out two white felt circles and two smaller black felt circles to make the eyes. Glue them to the bird head.
- 7. Cut a triangle beak out of yellow paper. Hot glue it onto the bird head.
- 8. Cut out a white felt rectangle with rounded corners and glue it to the bird body.
- 9. Cut zigzags out of yellow paper and glue them to the white rectangle.
- 10. Ta-da! Play with your bird!

Read them all!

NOTE: Use caution and have adult supervision when using hot glue guns.
